#### 1, Australian Open

#### 2. Subscriptions

# 3. The Bulletin Award – Early Winter – Henry Patten

The unofficial early winter bulletin award has to go to doubles specialist Henry Patten. The 28 year old, 6 foot 6 inches, world No.3, from Colchester, is now a double Grand Slam champion both with Finland's Harri Heliovaara. He won Wimbledon last July and now he has clinched the Australian Open in Melbourne.



This follows the end of season Tour Finals when he reached the semi-final. The left-handed Patten has won five career doubles titles and also 13 ATP Challenger titles -11 with Julian Cash. Ten of those Challenger titles came in 2022 – a record for the most Challenger titles won in a season



He played collegiate tennis for the University of North Carolina and became the No.1 ranked NCAA doubles player. He continued his postgraduate studies at Durham University. During two of his university summer breaks he worked for IBM as a courtside statistician at Wimbledon. He is also a chess enthusiast.



#### 4. Top 100

Britain has 20 players in the top 100 - singles (7) (3 men, 4 women) and doubles (13) (8 men, 5 women).



#### 5. Other Brits - Live Singles

BTJA player of the year award winner Jack Draper is world ranked 16, Cameron Norrie (WR63) and Jacob Fearnley (WR78).

Katie Boulter is at (WR24), Emma Raducanu (WR56), Sony Kartal (WR91) and Harriet Dart (WR100).



#### 6. Other Brits - Live Doubles

Henry Patten is at (WR3). There are five British players in the top 25 – Patten, Neal Skupski (WR16), Lloyd Glasspool (WR19), Julian Cash (WR23). Jamie Murray (WR25). There are also Joe Salisbury (WR43), Luke Johnson (WR52) and Marcus Willis (WR97), making it 8 Brits in the top 100.



There are also five British women in their top 100. Olivia Nicholls (WR41), Harriet Dart (WR61), Maia Lumsden (WR73), Heather Watson (WR80), and Emily Appleton (WR87)


